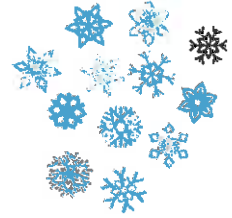

Class Photos—Get ready because on Monday 5th of March school photographers are coming! Please make sure your child/ren are looking smart for the occasion.



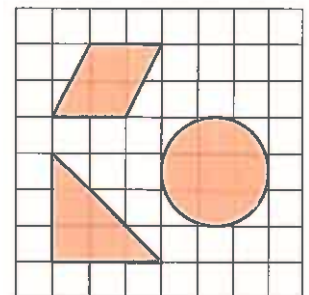

1H were learning about the **Star of Abraham**

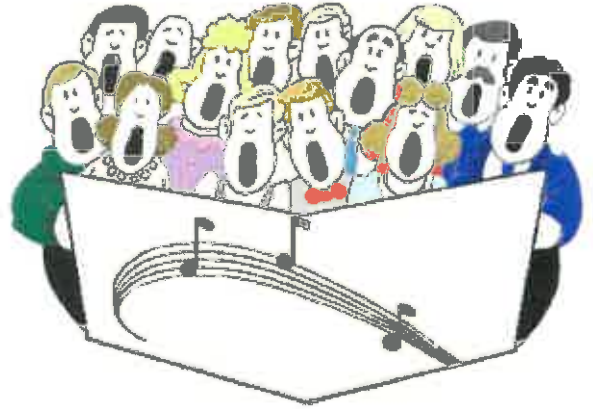


2C have been practising their **phonemes**.

... a Craghoppers waterproof coat which is black with an orange zip/trim? If found, please hand in to the office. Thank you.

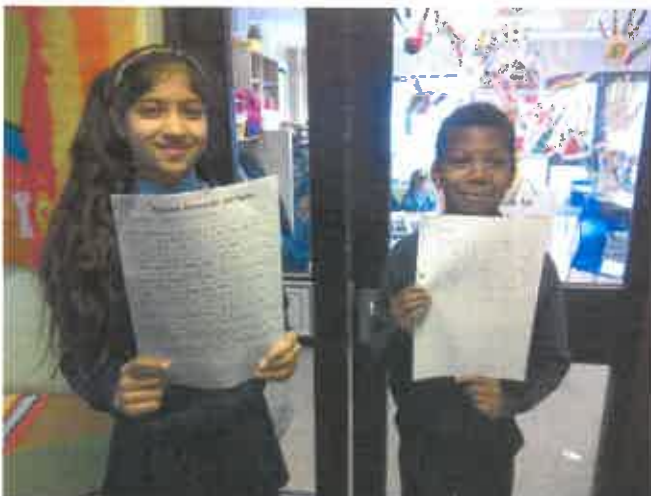


Football Match

Lent lunches at St Augustines' Church

WE'RE NOT EMBARRASSED TO TALK ABOUT POO IN PUBLIC!

At St Augustines' on Sunday we found out about the 'Toilet twinning' initiative - which links in nicely with our 'cleansing' themed service we enjoyed this week at school.

The 'toilet twinning' scheme is an initiative which aims to raise funds to build toilets in developing countries and also educates people on the need for good sanitation to avoid the spread of diseases such as cholera - which tragically cause one child to die every minute.

Each toilet costs £60 to build and we are hoping to get at least two so that the male and female loos in the church will be 'twinned' with a toilet overseas.....meaning we will get a special 'twinning' poster in each toilet along with geographical coordinates for the loo we have built.

To help raise the money we are running a 'lent lunch' after our morning service every Sunday in lent (with the exception of Mothering Sunday). If you or your family have been standing on a cold football field for hours...or just busy outside and fancy warming up with a bowl of steaming hot soup, bread, cheese, fruit for a small donation of your choice (not to forget good company and conversation) why not pop in just after 11.45? Or come along to one of our morning services (1045 am) with a Sunday school for children if you would like to try a different sort of Sunday morning then enjoy lunch afterwards
