Emergency food for people in crisis

Dear Friends,

Thank you so much for collecting food for the Chesham foodbank this harvest time. We rely completely on donations from the public to be able to provide emergency food for over 3,000 adults and children in our local community who need it each year.

The reasons people are referred to us are many and varied but of those who come to our doors are welcomed, listened to, cared for and supported to other agencies that may be able to help them with the underlying issues they may be facing. As one client said, "I am really grateful for the help I have received from the foodbank. I have been extremely unwell the last couple of months and have therefore got behind with bills and had no money for fuel, so I thank you."

A crisis can happen to anyone at any time of the year and with the fall roll out of Universal Credit planned for Chesham in December, we are sadly having to plan for an increase in the numbers of those needing our support. We would therefore urge to encourage you to consider how you could support the foodbank moving forward.

Here are a few ideas:

- Get in to receiving our mailed monthly shopping list which details any current shortages and donate non-perishable items to our warehouse
- Organise a food collection at another point during the year (currently between March and July)
- Like and Follow us on Facebook
- Consider hosting a fund raising event
- Set up a permanent collection point in your work place, school or church to encourage ongoing giving
- Join our 'Friends of Foodbank' group and give financially regularly - just 25 a month would help offset some of our ongoing running costs - details on our web site
- Make a donation through our Give.net app on our website.
